The work we do each day provides justice to thousands of our neighbors in Dutchess County who have nowhere else to turn, including protecting individuals from domestic violence; defending seniors against abuse; serving veterans on the homefront; supporting the rights of the disabled; ensuring that LGBTQ individuals are free from discrimination; and keeping families in their homes.

COVID-19 has highlighted the disparity between people throughout the State. The inequities faced by poverty influence a wide range of health and quality of life outcomes and increases the need for our services throughout the county.

In 1996, we opened our first office in Poughkeepsie and twenty five years later, have grown to a staff of 12 full-time attorneys and six support staff.

Our location is centrally located, convenient to public transportation, close to the courts and co-located with many of our community partners. Our practice areas include elder law, children's advocacy, kinship care, family law, domestic violence, benefits, consumer debt, eviction, foreclosure, and other civil matters involving clients who are disabled or vulnerable.


