A Message from our CEO



You might be surprised to learn that across the Hudson Valley, 1 in 4 people live at/or below 200% of the poverty line – a scant \$50,200 for a family of four. Many of these children and families are one tragedy away from being homeless. Indeed, an estimated 2.3 million evictions were filed in the U.S. in 2016. Sociologist Matthew Desmond is quoted as saying, that *"Eviction isn't just a condition of poverty; it's a cause of poverty... [it] is a direct cause of homelessness, but it also is a cause of residential instability, school instability [and] community instability."*

According to two recent studies, 98% of tenants in eviction cases in New York State were unrepresented by an attorney, and more than 60% of them had valid legal reasons to fight their eviction. But because they couldn't afford an attorney, most lost their homes.

Without stable housing, families can't work to support themselves, children fall behind in school, and communities incur high costs in the form of providing shelter and increased social services. All of this combines to put demands on taxpayers and their local governments to undo the cycle of poverty.

Simply put, we are in the middle of a housing crisis, that unchecked will lead to a massive homelessness problem in this country, in this state, and in the communities where we live and work. That's one of the reasons why almost 45% of the 15,000 cases we handled last year focused on preventing evictions, foreclosures and homelessness.

But that's not all we do as the only provider of free, comprehensive civil legal services to those living in the Hudson Valley that cannot afford an attorney when their basic human needs are at stake. We work across a wide variety of urgent civil practice areas including domestic violence, elder law, disability and veteran's benefits, and healthcare, just to name a few. And our work across the seven counties we serve—Westchester, Putnam, Rockland, Dutchess, Orange, Ulster, and Sullivan—impacted more than 34,000 household members in 2017.

70% of our clients were women and 40% of those impacted were children.

So, as you read this Annual Report to the Community, we encourage you to get more involved. Whether you make a contribution, volunteer as a Pro Bono attorney, help us raise money at a future event, share our content on social media, or simply tell a friend or two about the important work that we're doing, you will be helping us to make a difference right here in the communities where we live and work.

Because, it's only together that we can ensure ***Equal Access to Justice for all*** regardless of ability to pay.

Peekskill Remote Temporary Order of Protection Pilot Project

LSHV was selected by the New York State Office of Court Administration to participate in a pilot project that enables victims of domestic violence to remotely obtain a temporary order of protection using Skype or some other similar technology. Through this project, victims of domestic violence will be able to come to LSHV's Peekskill Office, meet with an attorney who will draft and electronically file a petition, and then Skype with the Court to conduct the ex parte hearing. This Project will assist victims who cannot travel to Family Court in White Plains (which takes over two hours on public transportation from Peekskill), may be afraid to go to court, and/or do not have childcare or money to be able to leave their kids for several hours to file an order of protection in person in White Plains Family Court.

Rockland County Family Court

LSHV received \$75,000 from Senator David Carlucci to provide domestic violence legal services to victims in Rockland County. As such, LSHV has a dedicated attorney handling these cases. In 2017, LSHV attorneys handled 559 cases for residents of Rockland County, impacting approximately 1,218 household members. 28% of those cases were related to domestic violence and family law.

Domestic violence jeopardizes the physical, emotional, and economic well-being of individuals and families.

That is why LSHV is committed to providing a strong legal service support system, which offers relief and hope to survivors.

Research shows that 25 percent of women and 15 percent of men report at least one life episode of domestic violence and that among same-sex couples, domestic violence occurs at the same rate as among straight couples. Studies have also shown that one of the key components in reducing domestic violence is ensuring that victims have access to legal services.

Last year we helped protect 1,683 survivors of intimate partner violence and we hope to continue that important work as a result of several new initiatives.



Casey's Story

It only takes one major illness... one job loss... one tragedy for many of us to find ourselves in a desperate situation and in need of a helping hand. Many of our clients come to us at the worst time in their lives, hoping to find a reprieve.

As a young woman, Casey* was trapped in an abusive marriage. Although her ex-husband, Anthony*, exhibited signs of controlling behavior in the beginning of their relationship, Casey ultimately agreed to marry him at the encouragement of her pastor, fellow ministry members, and family. The relationship became abusive almost immediately after the wedding. Anthony subjected her to rape, physical violence, financial control, extreme gaslighting, and verbal abuse. Throughout the early years of their marriage, the couple separated frequently. When Casey finally found the courage to leave Anthony, she did so without any money as he had control over their finances.

Casey moved around the country for nearly a year before she was able to secure a job in the Hudson Valley. Her plan was to save up enough money to pursue a divorce. But two years after she started her new life, Anthony found her and showed up at her place of work. He began stalking Casey everywhere – at her home, her work, and through text messages and emails – and he told her that he was staying in a hotel nearby. Shortly after, Casey found out that he had moved to New York.

Even though Casey was able to secure a divorce, Anthony continued to stalk her. Throughout the next few years, he moved five minutes away from her, drove down her block frequently, and finally left a large package for her, containing photographs and other items. Casey was not only shocked at the number of times that Anthony had tracked her down, but she was also terrified that he would not stop.

That's when Casey sought assistance from Legal Services of the Hudson Valley. First, LSHV helped Casey secure an order of protection against Anthony. An LSHV attorney worked with various police departments to ensure that he was served with notice of her family offense petition and the temporary order of protection. The attorney also appeared with Casey in family court, where, faced with the severity of the allegations against him, Anthony consented to a two-year full stay away order of protection.

Today, Casey is working and supporting herself, living in safety and free from fear.

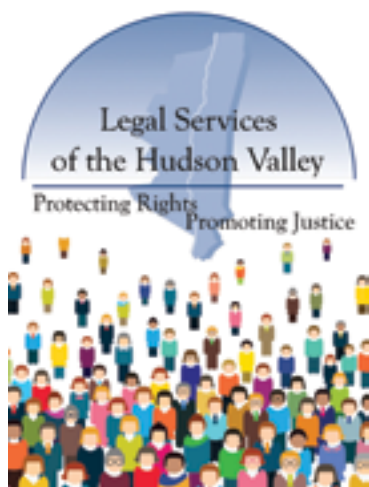

Diversity At LSHV

In 2014, LSHV joined with legal services providers throughout New York State in drafting and adopting the Leadership and Diversity Principles and Goals, which reflect our mission to serve our diverse client community and our aim of supporting our diverse staff.

Since that time, we have further focused our efforts to formulate a strategic plan for diversity and inclusion (D & I) at LSHV. We have developed initiatives focused on staff participation — including an Inclusion Council (comprised of 21 staff members from various positions and disciplines) — and we are providing ongoing education to our staff and Board of Directors throughout this process. 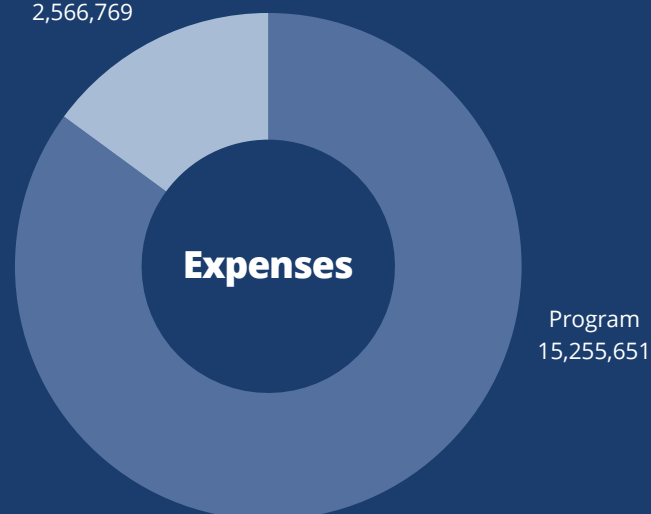

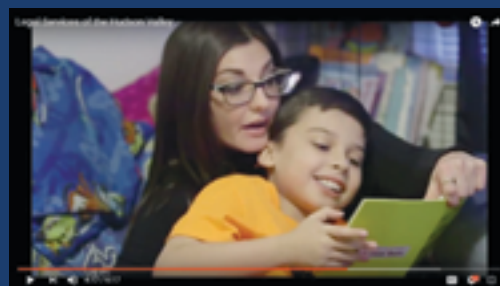
