
Legal Services of the Hudson Valley (LSHV) opened its first office in 1967 in White Plains, NY. Over time, LSHV has expanded to 10 offices, recently relocating our Spring Valley office to Nanuet.

The mission of LSHV is to provide high-quality counsel in civil matters for low-income individuals and families and other vulnerable persons who do not have access to legal representation to maintain their basic needs and to pursue equity through dismantling systemic oppression.



LSHV continues to expand, enhance and build awareness of the high-quality, comprehensive, free civil legal services we are providing in Rockland County. In 2021, our Spring Valley Office was relocated to Nanuet and currently houses eight full-time attorneys and two support staff.

We typically handle cases involving housing, benefits, consumer debt, children's advocacy, family law, discrimination, and other civil matters involving clients who are elderly or disabled. LSHV is funded through various sources. including local, state, and federal government contracts, private foundations and corporations, and individuals who believe everyone should have an attorney by their side when faced with legal proceedings.



LSHV works to ensure fairness in the justice system for those who can't afford an attorney when maintaining the basic necessities of life, such as food, shelter, and safety, are at risk.



Population, of which, 24.1% of children live in poverty;



of families with female heads of households and children present live in poverty;



persons in Rockland are over age 65; more than 6.5% of them live in poverty;

Rockland County's Fair Market Rent (FMR) for a two-bedroom apartment is \$2,053. To afford this, without paying more than 30% of income on housing, a household must earn \$39.48 hourly. The average renter's wage in Rockland County is \$12.14. At this rate, a renter must work 3.2 fulltime jobs to afford a two-bedroom apartment.
